

ASIA-PACIFIC PROJECT CONTROLS DURING COVID TIMES

WHAT THE JUDGES ARE LOOKING FOR

Judges are looking to recognise the extraordinary achievements within project controls (encompassing projects, programmes and/or portfolios) delivered specifically during, and because of, covid times. It could have been innovative, transformational or had a social impact. Its impact could have been covid specific or longer term. The judges will be looking to understand the immediate benefits and those longer term within health, organisations and/or society.

Each of the criteria is scored between 0 (no evidence at all) and 10 (perfect evidence) with each section being weighted accordingly (see %).

PROJECT CONTROLS MANAGEMENT (30%)

Context: 250 words

- Describe the background of the delivery including how the need for it arose and any partners if a joint venture.
- What specific aspect was it aimed at addressing?

Delivery: 250 words

- Describe the methods and techniques used to effectively manage the delivery including outputs, outcomes, and any benefits.
- How did this positively impact the ultimate delivery?
- Was it still ultimately delivered on time, to budget and to the required standard despite any covid restrictions or was it a 'get it sorted at any cost' deliverable?

Interfaces: 250 words

- Outline any disciplines, challenges or barriers that needed to be overcome with other areas, partners, clients etc.

People: 250 words

- Outline who worked on this delivery.
- Explain how internal and any external relationships were effectively managed and how a professional approach was developed and maintained throughout?

There will be no discussions or interviews with applicants of the awards' submissions. Each written submission and documents are reviewed by a team of independent, professional, industry judges who will not confer on entries. Their decisions are final.

- Demonstrate the delivery of the best value quality improvement for the stakeholders including balancing time, cost, quality, and benefits. **250 words**
- Demonstrate how and what benefits were delivered within health, organisations and/or society. **250 words**

CHALLENGES AND LESSONS LEARNED (30%)

• Challenges: 250 words

- What difficulties were anticipated and/or unforeseen during the delivery?
- How were these challenges overcome?

• Lessons Learned: 250 words

- What were the key lessons learned that have been captured and shared within the organisation because of the delivery?
- What methods were used to document and then share these experiences?
- Were lessons learned also shared outside of the organisation because of this delivery and, if so, what were they and how?
